AN ACT Relating to bone marrow donation; amending RCW 70.54.280; adding a new section to chapter 46.20 RCW; creating a new section; and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

The legislature finds that every three 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 6 minutes an American child or adult is diagnosed with a potentially 7 fatal blood disease. The legislature further finds that twenty percent to thirty-four percent of individuals with diverse heritage 8 never find a match. For many of these individuals, bone marrow 9 10 transplantation is the only chance for survival. The ultimate key to 11 survivability lies in increasing the number of bone marrow donors across all ethnicities, thus increasing the potential for a suitable 12 13 match. It is the intent of the legislature to increase awareness of 14 the national bone marrow program statewide and to increase the number of Washington residents on the national marrow donor registry in 15 16 order to increase the chance that all patients in need of bone marrow 17 transplants will find a suitable bone marrow match.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 46.20 19 RCW to read as follows:

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1 (1) The department shall provide each driver's license or 2 identicard applicant with written materials regarding making a 3 donation of bone marrow and being placed on the bone marrow donor 4 registry at the completion of their licensing transaction.

(2) The department of licensing, in cooperation with the national 5 б marrow donor program and other appropriate organizations, shall place signage in each of the licensing service offices that provide 7 background on the written materials that the applicant will receive 8 regarding bone marrow donation. This will include a notice that any 9 information provided by the driver's license or identicard applicant 10 11 will be used solely for allowing the applicant to obtain information 12 on becoming a possible bone marrow donor and will not be used for 13 commercial or fund-raising purposes.

14 (3) No organization or third party may utilize the information 15 obtained from this section for fund-raising or other commercial 16 purposes.

17 **Sec. 3.** RCW 70.54.280 and 1992 c 109 s 2 are each amended to 18 read as follows:

19 The department of health shall establish a bone marrow donor 20 recruitment and education program to educate residents of the state 21 about:

22 (1) The need for bone marrow donors;

(2) The procedures required to become registered as a potential bone marrow donor, including procedures for determining a person's tissue type; ((and))

26 (3) The procedures a donor must undergo to donate bone marrow or 27 other sources of blood stem cells; and

28 (4) The ability to obtain information about bone marrow donation 29 when applying for or renewing a personal driver's license or 30 identicard with the department of licensing.

The department of health shall make special efforts to educate 31 and recruit citizens from minority populations to volunteer as 32 potential bone marrow donors. Means of communication may include use 33 of press, radio, and television, and placement of educational 34 35 materials in appropriate health care facilities, blood banks, and state and local agencies. The department of health in conjunction 36 37 with the department of licensing shall make educational materials available at all places where and when drivers' licenses are issued 38 39 or renewed.

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1	By December 1, 2019, the department of health, in conjunction
2	with the department of licensing, must provide a report to the
3	appropriate committees of the legislature on the results and outcomes
4	of the efforts in increasing public awareness of bone marrow donation
5	and the number of individuals being placed on the bone marrow donor
6	registry from Washington state as a result of section 2 of this act.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. This act takes effect July 1, 2018.
