3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 16.36.140 and 2011 c 204 s 12 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (1) It is unlawful for a person to bring an animal into 7 Washington state without first securing a certificate of veterinary 8 inspection, reviewed by the state veterinarian of the state of 9 origin, verifying that the animal meets Washington state animal 10 health requirements. This subsection does not apply to animals that:

(a) Have been exempted by the director by rule; or

(b) Will be delivered within twelve hours after entry intoWashington state to:

(2) The director may monitor animals entering Washington state.
Persons importing, transporting, receiving, feeding, or housing
imported animals shall:

4 (a) Comply with the requirement and any exemptions specified in 5 subsection (1) of this section; and

6 (b) Make the animal and related records available for inspection 7 by the director.

8 (3) The director may adopt and enforce rules necessary to carry 9 out the purpose and provisions of this section.
